HORIZON 2020 AT A GLANCE

Horizon 2020 is the biggest EU Research and Innovation programme ever with nearly €80 billion of funding available over 7 years (2014 to 2020) – in addition to the private investment that this money will attract. It promises more breakthroughs, discoveries and world-firsts by taking great ideas from the lab to the market.

Horizon 2020 is the financial instrument implementing the Innovation Union, a Europe 2020 flagship initiative aimed at securing Europe's global competitiveness.

By coupling research and innovation, Horizon 2020 is helping to achieve this with its emphasis on three main pillars: **excellent science**, **industrial leadership** and tackling **societal challenges**. The goal is to ensure Europe produces world-class science, removes barriers to innovation and makes it easier for the public and private sectors to work together in delivering innovation.

Horizon 2020 is **Open to the World**. This means that **participants from all over the world, regardless of their place of establishment or residence, can participate in most of the calls of Horizon 2020**. In many cases, the EU will fund at least partly the participation of the international partners.

In addition to this general openness, several calls strongly **encourage or require cooperation** with non-EU partners in collaborative projects, target a certain country/region or refer to **global initiatives**, like the Global Alliance for Chronic Diseases.



For **individual researchers**, the European Research Council (ERC) and the Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions (MSCA) offer unparalleled funding opportunities for those who want to do research in Europe.
